Students at Sandbach College achieve excellent results and outcomes, consistently making progress well above national averages and achieving high grades; our levels of achievement and attainment are as high as any sixth forms in our local authority, including specialist colleges. We offer a fantastic range of courses including A levels, BTECs and project based qualifications. College Life

How will I study in College?

At College your lessons are just part of the picture. You'll need to study independently in your non-contact time, to do your own research and read widely around your subject. You will be expected to take a leading role in lessons, delivering presentations and getting involved in group discussions.

What are the class sizes?

Class sizes are smaller than in main school and are typically in between 10 and 20 students. For our more popular subjects we will often create two classes so that group sizes are effective. College classes are designed to allow for small group discussion and plenty of individual support from your teacher.

How is College different to Years 7-11?

You'll have greater freedoms in College alongside greater responsibilities. You will have a different dress code, non-contact time where you will study independently and times where you are free to leave site if you wish. College students are given greater freedoms to manage their own time but you will need to work very hard to achieve success!

What support is available in College?

We think you'll really enjoy your College career but we can all feel the pressure when juggling our academic commitments and busy personal lives. Your first port of call for pastoral support will be your form tutor who will get to know you really well and become someone you can talk to. The College Achievement Coordinators are also available to provide pastoral support. We also have full time counsellors available in College for students who need further professional support. Importantly though, we are a relatively small College where students and staff get to know each other well, creating a supportive and friendly atmosphere.

How should I choose which subjects to study?

We offer an exceptionally wide range of subjects – including traditional academic A levels as well as BTEC subjects which have a more substantial coursework element - so there is something to suit everyone's interests and aspirations. First and foremost, you should choose subjects which you are passionate about and that you enjoy. Be sure to look carefully at the subject specific course information on our website. If you have particular university or career aspirations, you should some research to find out which subjects will be required to achieve success. Applicants to Sandbach College all have a one-to-one guidance meeting where we'll discuss your application in depth and help you make the right choice.

What is the College campus like?

We are exceptionally lucky to have a new and modern College building separate from the main School. The College Learning Hub is the heart of this environment and is a spacious, quiet place to work with computers and printing facilities available. College students also have their own cafeteria, serving hot meals and snacks.

Will I have a say in how the College is run?

You will! We have a very active Student Union made up entirely of College students. Our Student Union meets regularly to organise College initiatives, to discuss what matters to students and to pitch these ideas to the College leadership team. The Student Union has already campaigned successfully for significant improvements to the College facilities. At Sandbach College we expect students to embrace opportunities to leadership and the Student Union is the perfect way to do this.













Course Information

The College is firmly committed to developing and delivering as wide a range of courses and opportunities as practically possible. There are over 40 courses to choose from, including A levels, BTECs, and project-based qualifications.

We are a mixed college where female, male and non-binary students are equally welcome.

The general guidance for admission of students into College is that individual students select courses appropriate to their ability and linked to their areas of academic interest.

The College is proud to have an open entry policy. We welcome students of all abilities, and a guidance meeting takes place to ensure that purposeful and realistic programmes of study are chosen.

Experience suggests that students embarking on A level courses or similar should have normally achieved at least 4 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, with a grade 5 or 6 desirable in some subjects. Subject specific course entrance requirements will naturally be discussed at your College interview.

As part of the application procedure, we ask both pupils already attending Sandbach High School and those attending other institutions to complete an application form and attend a College interview with a senior colleague.

Life after College

Whilst you are with us you will be supported by your form tutor, the College team and the careers adviser to determine how best to achieve your aspirations. You will find out about how to apply to university and what life and study at university entails. You will have visits from university staff and have the opportunity to visit universities. You will access high quality careers advice and undertake relevant work experience to help guide you to achieve your aspirations.

In Year 13 we will support you through the whole UCAS application process. You will also be guided in how best to prepare for higher level apprenticeships and have the opportunity to meet representatives from local and national employers. You will be supported in undertaking work experience.

Our students go on to a very diverse range of future courses and employment. In recent years our students have gone on to study at Oxford and Cambridge universities, have taken up places at Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary courses as well as music and drama conservatories. Around half of our students continue to study at prestigious Russell Group universities. Many of our students gain higher level apprenticeships, for example with the RAF, Barclays and Nestle.

Kathryn Maskew

Scientist (Biochemistry and Microbiology) Technical Tutor at the University of Loughborough **Ella** left Sandbach College in 2016 and secured a place on the BBC's Legal Apprenticeship scheme. (She was 1 of only 5 successful applicants from across the UK!)

Her apprenticeship was originally 2 years including part-time study of law, and included 3 placements: 1 at Children in Need, 1 in an external law firm DFW LLP, and 1 in the Business Affairs team.

In 2018 Ella completed the apprenticeship and qualified as a paralegal. She then took a year off studying to work full-time as Assistant in the Commercial, Rights and Business Affairs team

Since 2020 she has continued studying with the intention of qualifying as a solicitor in 2024, as well as being promoted to Commercial, Rights and Business Affairs Executive.

Ella presented a BBC podcast 'Not all Lawyers have Law Degrees' to promote and encourage Diversity and Inclusion in law careers and applications.

Leaving Sandbach in 2011, Kathryn moved to the University of Warwick to study Biomedical Sciences. Initially she was on a three year BSc course but soon decided to convert to an MBio Master of Biomedical Sciences, staying on an extra year to complete a research project. She graduated with First Class Honours in 2015.

Kathryn enjoyed biological research so much she decided to stay in Warwick to complete her PhD in Biochemistry in a doctoral training partnership, joint with the universities of Birmingham and Leicester.

When offered a job as a Scientist within the Microbiology department at INFEX Therapeutics, based at Alderley Park, Kathryn was able to work part-time while finishing her doctoral thesis, before she gained her PhD and began work full-time, eventually becoming lead biologist on an inhouse SARS CoV-2 coronavirus research project.

In October 2021 Kathryn took on a new role as Technical Tutor in Biological Sciences at the University of Loughborough, where she supports the teaching of biological sciences through laboratory practicals and managing research laboratories.



Jess Farrington

Journalist and Chief Reporter for Northwich, Knutsford, Winsford and Middlewich Guardian After studying English Lit, Performance Studies, Media Studies and Spanish (along with an EPQ on the effects of television on children) at Sandbach College, in 2014 Jess went on to the University of Sheffield for a degree in English Literature.

Progressing to a Master's degree and further qualifications in News Journalism, by 2019 she was qualified to the twin gold standards of the National Qualification in Journalism and the National Council for the Training of Journalists.

Jess's career developed as a news reporter with experience working in both print and online. She has worked all over the North West and North Wales in print, radio and TV and also as an online journalist focusing on popular viral content.

As Chief Reporter Jess now helps manage a team of reporters and plan content. She also covers council meetings, inquests and magistrates'/crown court sessions, managing published articles online and on social media.

Who can join us?

We welcome applications from all backgrounds. Our students come from our 11-16 High School and from other schools both in the local area and from further afield. We are a mixed college and male and female students are equally welcome.

We offer a wide range of courses at different levels. As part of the process we will help you to choose a course at an appropriate level. Some of our courses have entry requirements.

You are very welcome to bring your parents or someone else to help you to this meeting.

If you are not from our 11-16 High School, once you have accepted an offer to study at Sandbach College you will be invited to one of our Welcome Days. This will be an opportunity to sample lessons and meet the teachers and students you may share lessons with.



Enrolment Day

You will make your final decisions about the subjects and courses you will take at Sandbach College at enrolment. This will take place on the day you receive your GCSE results.
